Of the 14 speakers during Public Comment, only 2 supported the Gelson's project -- former Mayor Pam O'Connor (an Abundant Housing LA Board member) and another woman from Abundant Housing LA who mistakenly said there were going to be 70+ affordable apartments in the project..

There were only 2 mild outbursts during the meeting:

- A) When **Stephanie Reich**, the staff liaison, said something that seemed ridiculous, near the beginning of her long and somewhat disorganized presentation, the audience <u>laughed</u>, and she admonished us. After that, we remained quiet.
- B) After the first speaker during Public Comment, Peter Spelman, the audience applauded, and Stephanie admonished us again. After that, we used jazz hands, including for Mario Fonda-Bonardi's fiery speech.

After one of those occurrences, <u>Stephanie</u> threatened that **she would have us removed from the meeting** if this happened again.

To the contrary, when something like this happens during City Council meetings, whoever's **chairing** the meeting will say **matter-of-factly**, "No clapping or booing is allowed. If you <u>like</u> something, you can use jazz hands to express your approval."

Perhaps because the ARB Chair had recused himself, and the current Vice Chair, Barbara Kaplan, is soft-spoken, or because the laughter occurred during Stephanie's presentation, she took it upon herself to try to silence us. 





At the start of 2023, Santa Monica had 53,422 total housing units and a population of 91,720. Those numbers are compared with those at the start of 2022 when the city had 52,857 total housing units and a population of 91,739.

All of this has led to <u>a vacancy rate of 10.3% in Santa Monica</u>. Out of those 53,422 units, 47,941 were occupied. The city also showed an average of 1.86 people for every household...."
